Americanism - VC Paul Wackowski

Falling between World War II and Vietnam, the Korean War, which ended in an armistice, 70 years ago, has sometimes seemed to have a less vivid place in America's memory. But for those who fought in harrowing combat under brutal conditions there, the memories remain indelible, as they are for those who lost loved ones. And for those of Korean ancestry, the war marked the modern birth of a free and prosperous homeland.

The Korean War: Often referred to as the "Forgotten War," was a conflict that took place from 1050 – 1053 on the Korean Peninsula. It began on June 25, 1950, when North Korea, supported by the Soviet Union and China., invaded South Korea, which was supported by the United States and the United Nations.

Causes: Korea divisions after World War II, with the Soviet Union occupying the north, created tensions between the two sides. North Korean Kim II -Song sought communist reunification of the peninsula, leading to the south invasion.

International Involvement: The United Nations Security Council passed a resolution condemning the invasion and authorized military intervention to repel the North Korean forces. A UN coalition, mostly led by the US, was formed to support South Korea, while China and the Soviet Union backed North Korea.

Stalemate: This quickly turned into stalemate along the 38th parallel, the dividing line between the two Koreas. Both sides launched offensives and counter offences but failed to achieve a decisive victory. This was settled into a battle of attrition with heavy casualties on both sides.

Armistice Agreement: After three years of intense fighting, negotiations led to the signing of an armistice agreement on July 27, 1953. The agreement restored the pre-war borders, created the Korean Demilitarized Zone [DMZ], and established a cease-fire. However, no formal peace treaty has been signed, and technically, the war is still going on.

Human Cost: The Korean war had a significant human cost. Estimates suggest that over 2.5 million people, including civilians, military personnel, and prisoners of war, lost their lives. This resulted in widespread destruction of infrastructure, leaving the Peninsula divided.

Legacy: The Korean war had lasting impact. Communist North Korea Kim dynasty versus the South Korea democratic and prosperous nation.

The conflict shaped the dynamics of the cold war,

and influencing subsequent US foreign policy.
